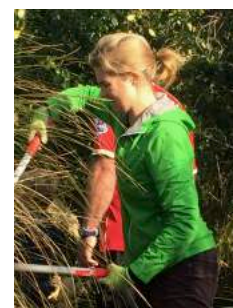
Children after school: We are having some children injuring themselves, or having some 'tired-issues' after school. Please ensure you pick up your child BY 3.30pm.

# Kairanga Sports

All sports notices are regularly posted on our school FB page.

**Rugby** - Our Kairanga Kids are encouraged to join our local Te Kawanu Junior Rugby Club, as rugby is not organised through school. Teams accommodate rugby players from 5-13 years of age from ripa rugby through to XV aside tackle. For more information see the TK Junior Rugby Facebook page or website. Registrations open around March/April with the season starting in May and goes through to September.

**Touch Rugby** - All ages are encouraged to join Kairanga teams that are organised through school. Teams play at Monrad Park with the competition run by the Highbury Whanau Centre. Registrations begin mid September. Teams play for a total of 10 weeks from October to early March either side of the Summer Holidays.

**Netball** - We have Kairanga netball teams for Yr 1 to Yr 8, depending on numbers. Check out the season calendar on the Netball Manawatu website for season dates as these change each year. This year Yr 1/2 start in October, Yr 3/4 start in March, Yr 5/6 and Yr 7/8 start in May.

**Hockey** - Kairanga Kids play both summer and winter hockey through Te Kawanu Junior Hockey. See the FB page or website for contact details and season dates. The games are played at Manawaroa Park in Palmerston North every Saturday morning. Yr 6 and under are on the grass fields. Yr 7/8 play on the turf. The 2019 winter hockey season starts in early May.

**Soccer** - Kairanga Kids that are keen to play football generally join the Marist Junior Football Club. They have a great programme for younger players especially, with the First Kicks programme which starts in March. Find out more information about all the grades on the Marist Junior Football FB page.

**Basketball** - Kairanga have teams available for Yr 5/6 and 7/8. Registrations open in April. The season starts in May, with finals in September. The Yr 5/6 play on Thursdays and the Yr 7/8s on Wednesdays. This is a long season with games played at the CET Arena on Pascal Street.

**Cricket** - Kairanga Kids join the Te Kawanu Junior Cricket Club to play all forms of the game from soft ball for younger players with skills sessions through to Yr 7/8s who play a 9 aside hard ball game of limited overs. The TK Junior Cricket Club are also contactable through their FB page.

**Volleyball** - Kairanga participate in the Term 3/4 competition that goes from September to November totalling around 6 games. It is held in the B&M Centre on Pascal Street. We often have a number of teams at the Yr 7/8 level. Registrations are taken at the end of August.
