The Education Review Office left last week, after a thorough and very rigorous process. We were left feeling that they had a good grasp of our school, and its successes. They spent more time than previously in classrooms, viewing children's learning and teachers' skills and planning. Ultimately the ERO are here to judge the performance of the Board of Trustees, working through the Principal and staff, to see how effective they are in meeting the educational needs of the pupils and community.

The ERO were very complementary about our performance. The draft report will be given to the Board in a month's time for comment, before being confirmed shortly after that.

In their oral feedback, the ERO used phrases like 'The school is effective in lifting achievement for pupils.' 'Most pupils achieve here', 'We have a depth of leadership and a relentless focus on achievement', 'We have lots of purposeful learning going on, supported by teachers who use a variety of techniques', 'staff know learners well and respond to their needs'.

I'm sure there will be a lot more in the full report, but just those comments above should give you great heart that your school is high-performing, is effective and caters for all pupils very well.

We're not perfect, and I'm sure the full report will reflect the things we can do better, but at the present time, I'm pretty happy that we continue to be a great little school!
