**End of year Reports: December.**  
 The End of year report forms are undergoing a change this year, as we review and incorporate better thinking into them, and use the Progress and Consistency Tool, to ensure that reports to parents on progress and achievement are clear and accurate. We will be informing you of changes in each of the next few newsletters to prepare you for the information you will receive.  
 The second change you will see is the use of the **PaCT Teacher Judgements** for Reading, Writing and Maths. These are in **graph form**, they report on progress over time, and they have several key elements:

- A rating against the New Zealand Curriculum (NZC) Levels, including where they are at against our expectation;
- A line of expected progress against the NZC and their current trajectory of progress;
- Comments about what learning they do at this level and what comes next.

These three elements I will be explaining further in the next newsletters.
